

COVID PROTOCOL FOR DUBAI, UNITED ARAB EMIRATES

Before you travel:

1. Ensure that you meet all visa requirements to visit the UAE
2. All Passengers arriving in Dubai must take a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test up to four days prior to their date of travel (maximum 96 hours), unless otherwise stated. Other test certificates including antibody tests and home testing kits are not accepted in Dubai.
3. The Negative PCR COVID-19 certificate must be printed in English or Arabic. No hand written, SMS or digital certificates will be accepted. You may be required to take another test at Dubai Airports upon arrival.
4. Children under the age of 12 and passengers who have a moderate or severe disability are exempt from this test.
5. Ensure you have medical travel insurance with international coverage that covers COVID-19 before travelling. You will need to sign a declaration to bear all costs of quarantine and treatment and complete a Health Declaration Form before departure confirming you are not displaying COVID-19 symptoms.
6. If you are travelling with [Emirates airline](#) and have purchased your ticket after 1 December 2020, you will automatically benefit from additional multi-risk travel insurance provided by AIG Travel.

At the Airport:

The following is also required for passengers travelling with [Emirates airline](#):

- In addition to the COVID-19 PCR test certificate required for travel, passengers are required to carry out a Rapid COVID-19 Antigen test within 4 hours of departure.
- Passengers are to arrive at the airport to carry out the Rapid COVID-19 antigen test first before check in.
- Results will be out within 15 to 20 minutes. Upon having a negative rapid test result, passengers may proceed to the check-in counter.
- The location for testing in the Lagos and Abuja International Airport is: Mobi Health booth in the Check-in area.
- The cost of testing is N36,800 (Lagos Airport), N25,800 (Abuja Airport).
- Passengers are advised to pre-book the test online at <https://mobihealthconsultcovid19.mobihealthinternational.com/> Passengers may make payment online, via POS or cash.

Arriving in Dubai:

The following entry rules apply to passengers travelling to Dubai from Nigeria:

- All passengers have their temperature taken with thermal screening devices
- Passengers may be required to take a second PCR test upon arrival in Dubai.
- Where you are mandated to take another PCR test at the airport, you will be instructed to remain in your accommodation until you receive the result.
- In the case of a positive result, you will need to strictly comply with a 14-day quarantine as instructed by the Dubai Health Authority
- You will not be able to enter Dubai if you have been in South Africa within 10 days of departure to Dubai. This includes transiting in other countries within 10 days before travelling to Dubai.
- Visitors must follow all the precautionary measures applied in Dubai including wearing masks, maintaining two-metre social distance and washing hands regularly.

Flying to Nigeria

When you are returning to Nigeria, the following entry rules apply to all travelers:
Travelers are required to take two mandatory tests.

Test 1: Mandatory PCR test within 4 days (96 hours) before departure from Dubai

Test 2: Mandatory repeat PCR test 7 days after arrival

Travelers are further advised to make payments for their repeat PCR tests through a certified private lab via the NCDC travel portal before arrival into the country.
